END OF THE YEAR REPORT FY 2018

This annual report highlights the activities accomplished by the Kings Contrivance Village Board and staff between May 1, 2017 and April 30, 2018. April marked our village's 41st as a village of Columbia. We are continuing our advocacy work for our community as well as offering programs, classes, and meeting space in Amherst House.

WHO WE ARE

Every year, in April, all village residents are encouraged to participate in the election of Village Board members (every other year for Columbia Council Representative). Last year, there were five seats on the Village Board and one Columbia Council Representative. Board members serve two-year terms and elections are staggered. During the past year the following residents served on the Village Board: Chair: Barbara Seely; 1st Vice-chair: Christiana Rigby; 2nd Vice-chair: Lilah Haxton; and members: Fred Niziol and Melissa Hogle. Shari Zaret served as our Columbia Council Representative. The Board is responsible for determining how village funds are budgeted and spent. Funding is received from two sources: a Columbia Association Assessment Share, and association activities/building rentals.

The Board employs a village manager who oversees the day to day operation of the village and acts as advisor to the Board. The manager hires a covenant advisor who processes forms for architectural alteration and acts as a resource person to the Resident Architectural Committee (RAC) and residents. The manager also hires any other necessary staff, staying within the financial parameters set by the Board. The current village staff is comprised of the following: Beverley Meyers, Village Manager; Laura Parrish, Covenant Advisor; Luz Borrero, Events & Information Coordinator; Erika Cheney, Operations Coordinator and Bookkeeper; Patricia Hricko and Julie Steffanoff, Head Facility Assistants; Darshana Dave, Kelly Dutcher, Grace Cheney and Shaneyka Hollis, Facility Assistants.

THE VILLAGE BOARD

The Village Board acts as an advocate for residents. During the past year, the board dealt with a number of issues. The board: elected board and Architectural

grants; recognized Ed Gordon as Volunteer of the Year; donated funds to Howard County Police Department and Hands Around Howard County; donated a free use of Amherst House to Hammond High School Casino Night for their fundraiser and The Orthodox Church of St. Matthew for their silent auction; collected items for Girl Scout Troop 1009's "Operation Christmas Child" and school supplies for the "Prepare for Success" program; attended county meetings for development issues in and around the village; met with various agencies including, State representatives Guy Guzzone, Frank Turner, Shane Pendergrass and Vanessa Atterbeary for a legislative session review, Howard County Executive and County representatives to discuss village issues, Howard County Police, Hammond High School Principal, Dr. John DiPaula, CA Board Chair, Andy Stack to overview CA projects and CA Aquatics department to introduce the neighborhood pool managers.

COMMITTEES

The Village Board appoints residents to committees. Ad hoc committees are appointed from time to time as warranted. The Resident Architectural Committee (RAC) is the only standing committee and the most active committee. This team of dedicated volunteer residents currently includes Ed Gordon, Chair; Nick Fessenden Vice-Chair; Greg Dickman, Bruce Altschuler, Jason Protheroe, Joe Haugh and Michele Mercer. The RAC meets twice monthly, on the second and fourth Wednesday, to review architectural alteration requests. 121 letters of compliance/non compliance were issued in FY18. 119 inquiries were logged in and dealt with by the covenant advisor, 90 were successfully resolved in FY18. 22 were found not to be village covenant violations. 7 complaints remained unresolved at the end of the fiscal year. 199 applications for 258 alterations were processed. 194 applications were approved, 7 were approved with provisions, 2 were approved as an exception, 0 were withdrawn, 1 was tabled, and 5 were denied. 51 applications were approved through the *Speedy Process*. These numbers illustrate the extent to which the committee members spent time and energy working with residents to reach optimum results. The most popular alteration approval request was for color change (32 applications), fences (26 applications), decks (23 applications), lighting (22 applications), landscaping (18 applications), front door (14 applications) and sheds (14 applications).

We also rent Amherst House for functions. If you are interested in hosting a wedding, party or business meeting, please call for our very reasonable rates. We are open to CA residents and non-residents for rentals. A strong emphasis is placed on maintenance of our facilities and a large part of the interior of Amherst House is painted annually. The Neighborhood Center at Meeting Room in Macgill's Common, which was the former long term home for Children's Time Preschool is now being leased by Columbia Association.

THE VILLAGE OFFICE

The village office is located at Amherst House and is open from 9 am to 9 pm Monday through Thursday, 9 am to 5 pm on Friday, and 10 am to 1 pm on Saturday. The office offers many services such as information and referrals, copying, notary, faxing and bus ticket sales. The village newsletter, *The Crown Prints*, is distributed to residents through the *Columbia Flier* on the second and fourth Thursday of each month or send us your email and we'll send it to you directly.
