POLICE REMIND RESIDENTS TO SECURE GARAGES, HOMES AND CARS

Howard County police are reminding citizens to keep their homes secure now that summer has officially begun.

During the warm spring and summer months, police receive an increased number of reports of burglaries from open and unlocked garages and sheds. Residents frequently leave garage doors open while doing yard work or spending time outdoors. Burglars use this opportunity to steal property from the garage and gain access to the interior of the home.

In 2008, police responded to 122 residential burglaries of garages and sheds. Of those, 71, almost three out of every five incidents, had no signs of forced entry. Both July and August had the highest number out of any month, with 15 cases in each month. As of May 31, there have been 50 residential burglaries of garages and sheds in 2009.

In an effort to ensure the security of homes and neighborhoods, police offer the following tips.

- Always keep all doors, including the garage door, closed and locked. Ensure that the door leading from the garage to the interior of the home is also locked.
- Always lock your vehicles, and remove valuable property. A garage door opener in an unlocked car is like a key to your home.
- Report suspicious people or activity by calling 911. It is always helpful if you note the make, model and tag number of any suspicious vehicles in your neighborhood. Additional crime prevention information is available online at www.hcpd.org
