Howard County's Dept. of Recreation and Parks wants to alert you to "Cell phone leagues," a major challenge that their department is facing. "Cell phone leagues" are very large groups of football and/or soccer players who scan the county for empty fields, call each other, and then meet at the field to play in unorganized "leagues". These leagues are appearing at various parks and fields throughout the county and here in our village. These "leagues" are not approved by Dept. of Recreation and Parks and the participants have not received any permission to use the fields.
